The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award equips young people with the skills and confidence to adapt and thrive in an ever-changing world. The framework not only helps to develop essential life skills but encourages young people to utilise them in their wider community too.

A recent survey of Award participants found that:

- 78% said they feel more confident
- 78% said they feel more determined
- 83% said they are more resilient
- 86% said they now see challenges as opportunities to develop

Benefit from mentoring in a less formal setting. Many volunteers believe it helps them to better understand their students - and can even improve their teaching.


